Dr. N. Shaun Matthews, DDS, MD, FDS, FRCS (OMFS) is the inaugural

Charles E. Tomich Endowed Professor of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery. He also serves as Chair of the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and Hospital Dentistry, Associate Dean for Hospital Affairs, Chief of Service of Dentistry for IU Health, and Director of the TMJ Institute. He is internationally recognized for his work in temporomandibular joint surgery and has been responsible for creating multiple, collaborative TMJ clinics embracing both dental and medical disciplines.

Shelby Funk is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker at IU School of Dentistry and is charged with running the IUSD Interprofessional Practice Social Work Program. As a part of the TMJ Institute, Shelby works with the patients to identify needs within the areas of social, emotional, mental, and behavioral health that are impacting the patient's TMJ issues and overall treatment.
