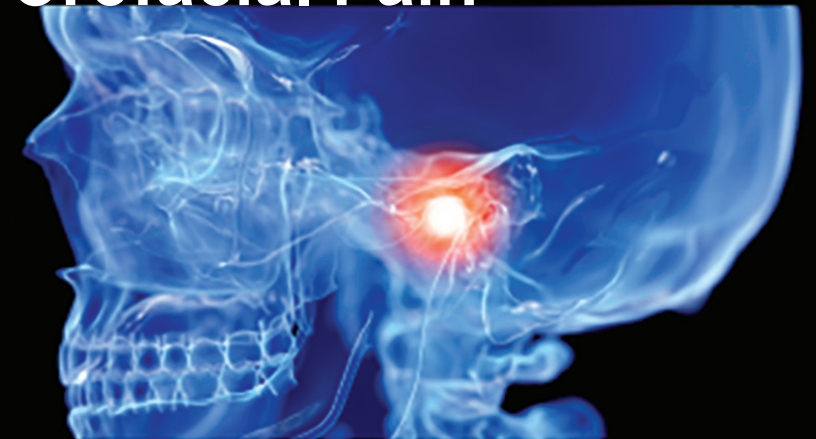

This second lecture course on the multidisciplinary management of TMJ disorders forms an important part of the TMJ Institute's educational mission. This year's focus is addressing initial diagnosis and treatment options. Here at Indiana University School of Dentistry's TMJ Institute, we have created a true, multidisciplinary clinic model that is both innovative and unique by offering what we call a "one-stop shop" for the management of patients with challenging, chronic TMJ problems. Our mission is to provide comprehensive, contemporary, collaborative care for all TMJ patients in Indiana and beyond and to inform the current and future generations of oral health care professionals about the fundamental principles of the management of temporomandibular dysfunction.

The course content will be delivered via a series of didactic lectures, case presentations and a moderated panel discussion. It will provide you the opportunity to learn from a range of specialists with specific expertise in the management of TMJ disorders including an oral and maxillofacial surgeon, orofacial pain specialist, physical therapist, psychiatrist, comprehensive care dentist, and social worker.

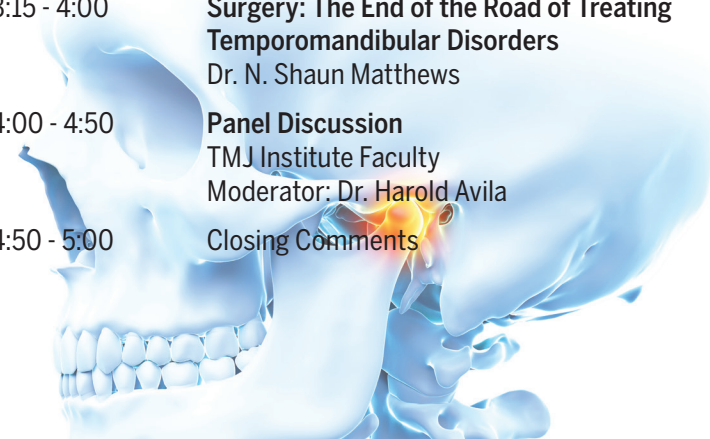

FEATURED SPEAKERS

Dr. N. Shaun Matthews is Clinical Professor and Chair of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Indiana University School of Dentistry. He also serves in the role of Associate Dean for Hospital Affairs and Director of the TMJ Institute.

Dr. Massimiliano Di Giosia is a Visiting Clinical Associate Professor at IUSD. He completed a residency program in Orofacial Pain at the University of Kentucky, a postgraduate program in Headache Medicine at the University of Turin, Italy and an Orthodontic residency program at the University of Cagliari, Italy. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Orofacial Pain.

Dr. Michael Bushey is an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at Indiana University School of Medicine, and is the Medical Director for the Indiana University Health Pain Rehabilitation Program. Dr. Bushey attended the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine for medical school and residency training, where he trained in the Johns Hopkins Pain Treatment Program.

Shelby Funk is a Licensed Healthcare Social Worker at IU School of Dentistry and is charged with running the IUSD Interprofessional Practice Social Work Program. As a part of the TMJ Institute, Shelby works with the patients to identify needs within the areas of social, emotional, mental, and behavioral health that are impacting the patient's TMJ issues and overall treatment.

Dr. Frank Bates is a Board-Certified Geriatric Physical Therapist and has over 20 years of experience in outpatient physical therapy, currently working at IU Health. He maintains a generalist orthopedic physical therapy practice with focused interest in pain and conditions of the TMJ, head, and neck.

Navia Novosel is a fourth year dental student at Indiana University School of Dentistry. She presented at the 2023 American Association for Dental, Oral and Craniofacial Research Conference in Portland, OR.

Dr. Gilles Lavigne is a (oral medicine) professor, faculty of dental medicine at the Université de Montréal in Montréal, Canada. Dr. Lavigne is internationally recognized for his research on sleep bruxism, sleep apnea and pain and sleep interactions. He has served as the vice-dean for research and dean (faculty of dental medicine at the Université de Montréal), president of the Canadian Sleep Society and Canadian Pain Society, and holds a Canada Research Chair in Pain, Sleep & Trauma. He received an honoris causa (University of Zurich, Switzerland) and Order of Canada, has authored over 270 papers, and co-edited four books.

Dr. Charles Greene graduated from University of Illinois at Chicago College of Dentistry where he has been distinguished as Professor Emeritus in the Department of Orthodontics. He has been involved for many years in clinical research and teaching in the area of temporomandibular disorders and orofacial pain.
